






Who is Rahab?

•A sex worker who lived in the walls of the city of Jericho with her family and "all that belong to her" •Sex work, in any age, was the last act of a desperate woman with no other way to support herself •Clearly isn't married •She struck a deal with Israelite spies to save a lot of non-Hebrews and herself



Where did she live?

- •14 miles from the Jordan River in a city called Jericho
 - •"In" the outer wall of the city
 - •Poorest part of town, open to first attack
 - •Lived with father, mother, brothers; no husband
 - •Only walls not to collapse



What was her context?

- •1550-1200 BCE
- •Pagan, specifically naturalistic polytheist
- •Spies (really, pre-teens) sent to scout the land...but they ended up where?
 - •Babylonian Law of Hammurabi
 - •City-state with a monarchy
 - •Lies = act of treason. (:2-3)



What was so important?

- •"Yahweh is Lord in heaven and on earth" is faith statement
- •Covenant of *hesed* must be reciprocated; but she acts on blind faith in TOTAL strangers (and teenage boys, no less)
 - •Lineage to Jesus
 - •No one is out of God's reach
- •God uses the last and the least to advance kindness and grace



SIMBOLIC



•Red is symbolic of blood, war, destruction

•Blood plague in Egypt

•Red horse of war in Revelation

•Esau was "red" and fights with his brother over red stew

•Scarlet is manmade for dye; changing something natural into something it is not (a sign of luxury)

•Represents sin and the resulting death

•Scarlet is the color of the blood at the first Passover; the color of liberation






•Scarlet is most often associated with the trade of sex work

•Rahab (and Israel) made their sinful choices

Who Is Rahab?

•Zonah vs. Qedesh

•Josephus calls her house katagogion

•Several rabbinical writings gloss the *zonah* with the Greek *pandokeus*, or innkeeper

•*Zonahs* often worked out of the seedier places, like taverns and inns

•The line is blurry, so a female innkeeper could be a euphemism for a sex worker

• The Israelites saved her family "and all who belonged to her"



Where did she live?

• In a house inside or against the outermost wall of the Pagan city of Jericho, 14 miles from the Jordan River, at the base of a mountain range

•Ruled by a monarch who upheld the ancient laws

•She wasn't the stranger in a foreign land; she was at home

•Whose reputation is really at stake here?



What was her context?

- She was the head of a household
 - She was a business owner
 - She wasn't Hebrew
 - She wasn't bound by the law of Yahweh or the writings of Torah
 - Her law code was Hammurabi



Why she is important

- What matters more to God: sinful behavior or content of the heart?
 - She also saved the spies; total strangers
 - The Hebrew word for *hid* is the same verb used when Moses' mom hid him in the basket for his safety and nurture
 - She's in the ancestral line of Jesus
 - She was a visionary who got things done



Important to know Rahab

- •Deserves more than "Rahab the prostitute"
- •See past the labels we put on each other
- •We know what God asks of us, in regard to strangers in our country
- •At best, her lived experience is ignored; at worst, history has silenced her
 - •Nevertheless, she persisted and would not be tamed
